Description

This two story, four bay brick or possibly brick cased log house is said to be among the oldest, if not the oldest brick house in Keedysville. It has six over six pane sash and a main entrance in the third bay from the north end. The south end wall is German sided. The house is said to have been built by Samuel Keedy for Mr. Wyand about 1836. In 1877, there was a shoe shop behind the house which according to Margaret Burtner Moats' book, employed 10 apprentices. The 1877 Atlas records the property as belonging to J. Hoffman. According to Arita Van Rensselaer's history, members of the Cost family conducted a store here first. It later became Wyand's jewelry store, having been acquired by Mrs. Wyand through her family, the Hoffmans.




