Description

This large stone house is a two story, six bay L-shaped building. The house is constructed of large coursed blocks of limestone with single large blocks set over the windows and doors. This type of construction is characteristic of the mid 19th century. The facade of the house is arranged symmetrically with the two central first story bays being entrances. Windows have six over six pane sash within narrow frames and the entrances are similarly framed with transoms. Chimneys are located within the end walls.

This was the home of George Snavely in 1877. The Snavely (Snively) family were a prominent family in the Keedysville area and were some of the first settlers here. Mr. Snavely operated a butcher shop across the street and north of this property.




