Description

This High Victorian Gothic style influenced house is a two story, five bay frame structure with a central projecting cross gable pavilion. Windows have two over two pane sash within architraves with peaked tops. The main entrance is located in the center bay and another is located above it at the second story level where the projecting gable forms a balcony. A porch with round columns extends across the front. Chimneys are located inside the end walls. The house is set back from the street on a landscaped lot.

This house is one of a pair built by the Hoffman family who also owned a farm on Keedysville Road that was used as a hospital after the Battle of Antietam. This property, as of November, 1993 is still in the ownership of the family.

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


