Description

This farmhouse marks the south end of Keedysville. It is a two story, four bay brick structure with an off-center front entrance. Windows have six over six pane sash beneath wide wood lintels. The entrance is in the second bay from the south end. The house retains several outbuildings including a log smoke house and a paling fence characteristic of the 19th century. The frame bank barn associated with this property is to the south on a separate piece of property.

This house, said to have been built by Caleb Wyand was the centerpiece of a farm owned by the Wyands at least since the mid 19th century. It is shown both on military maps of the 1860s and the 1877 Atlas. With its off center front door it reflects Germanic building traditions common to this region.


