Description

This two story, three bay frame house is burned out with only portions of its exterior walls and roof intact. Its covering was German siding and windows were trimmed with peaked architraves. There was a central cross gable. The entrance was in the central bay and the roof covering was standing seam sheet metal. A porch across the front had replaced supports.

This building has High Victorian Gothic influence and reflects Keedysville's later development. It is said to have been built for a Mr. Hoover.


