Description

This structure is a two story, three bay aluminum sided log house with an enclosed porch across its front or south elevation. Windows have six over six pane sash and the roof is covered with standing seam sheet metal.

This house is said to have been built about 1880 by a local contractor by the name of Kitzmiller. Its form and appearance suggest the influence of earlier vernacular building types.


