### Description:

#### Summary:

This two story frame farmhouse appears to date from the very early 20<sup>th</sup> century. The main south façade features a cross gable and a wide porch. A two story ell adjoins the rear of the house. A frame outbuilding is located to the north. The house is covered with narrow guage siding and has decorative shingles and gingerbread trim in the cross gable. It retains a high degree of exterior integrity.

This two story frame farmhouse faces south. The three bay main façade features a cross gable and a broad porch. The central entrance is flanked by sidelights and topped by a transom.

A two story ell extends to the rear of the house. A frame outbuilding, a summer kitchen or wash house stands to the north of the dwelling.

Narrow board siding sheathes the house. Scalloped wooden shingles distinguish the cross gable. The building has 1/1 sash windows topped by a molded architrave. Double windows light the central front bays. The window aprons are finished in a double ogee curve. Asphalt shingles cover the roof. The outbuilding has 2/2 sash and a metal roof.

This is an especially well-finished house that remains in good original condition.


