This Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties (MIHP) Addendum was prepared in accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) negotiated among H.B. Mellott Estate, Inc., the Water Management Administration Mining Program Maryland Department of the Environment, and the Maryland Historical Trust. A stipulation of the MOA required that an MIHP Addendum be prepared for each of the 14 properties nearby to the John Lung Farmstead (WA-II-149), which have a history or potential significance similar to the John Lung Farmstead.

This Addendum includes the property name, address, MIHP number, and a brief, one-to-two sentence comment on the property's condition, and one or more black and white photographs. Each photograph was printed in accordance with the photography requirements of the Maryland Historical Trust. The field survey and photography were conducted from the public right-of-way.

The mid nineteenth-century stone farm complex is hardly visible from the public right-of-way. The house has been abandoned for many years. The windows, doors, front porch, and front eave were no longer extant in April 2007. The railing and column on the south elevation and the second floor balcony are missing. The barn has holes in the roof and the vertical board siding on the east wall is missing. The small wood-frame outbuilding between the house and barn has been removed and replaced with an entrance to a quarry and concrete plant.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm complex is located on the west side of Maryland Route 66 approximately one half mile north of I-70 southeast of Hagerstown in Washington County. The buildings are situated on a ridge, facing east and overlooking Beaver Creek and the highway.

The house is a two story stone and frame structure. At the front elevation it is three bays wide displaying coursed limestones. Extending to the rear is a five bay stone and frame wing which displays frame construction on its south elevation and in the west gable. The south elevation has a two story porch which is included under the main roof span. The framed parts of the building are sheathed with German siding.

Window frames are narrow and hold single pane double hung sashes. Most windows have pairs of shutters with paneled upper sections and lower parts with movable louvers. Large blocks of stone are present above the windows. An early 20th century hipped roof dormer with double windows has been added to the south slope of the roof. It is not centered with other openings in the front elevation.

The main entrance is located in the north end bay of the front wall where a door with five horizontal panels is hung beneath a transom with diamond shaped panes. Across the front elevation is a one story porch supported by round doric type pillars.

The roof is sheathed with modern asphalt shingles in a bright blue color. Brick chimneys with corbels at their tops are located inside the end walls.

The interior displays original 19th century graining on much of its woodwork, doors with six low relief panels and mid 19th century trim. Early 20th century period work appears in the back section.

Behind the house are a frame wash house or out kitchen with a large exterior stone chimney and other domestic outbuildings.

South of the house is a large stone end bank barn. It displays two distinct styles of masonry between the gable area and its end wall.

The buildings are in deteriorated condition and are vacant. The house has been vandalized recently. The property contains almost 174 acres and is used partially for a quarry.


