DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the north side of Cool Hollow Road west of Route 40-A southeast of Hagerstown and Funkstown in Washington County, Maryland. The house stands near the edge of the road and faces south. It is a two story three bay log house sheathed with composition siding standing on low fieldstone foundations. A one story, one bay extension, also presumably of log construction is attached to the rear of the house.

Windows are relatively small in relation to wall area and have narrow frames holding two over two pane sashes. Only one window is located in each end wall except for small openings lighting the attic. The main entrance is centered in the front elevation. It is sheltered by a small modern gable roofed porch.

The roof extends beyond the end walls of the house and is sheathed with composition shingles and slates. Brick chimneys are located inside the end walls, the east end chimney being the larger. A brick exterior chimney stands along the end wall of the extension.

West of the house is a 20th century gambrel roofed barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This two story log house is one of many such structures in Washington County. Like most log houses it has been sheathed and has wooden siding beneath the present composition surface. Although most of the visible exterior elements of this house would appear to date from the 20th century, the general form of the house and the size and placement of its windows could suggest 18th century construction.

According to a local historian, John Grey acquired the land on which this farm stands in 1782 & willed it to his son Peter in 1789. Peter Grey died in 1804 leaving a number of children & a moderate estate. The property is believed to have remained in the Grey family through much of the 19th century.
