DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmhouse is located at the end of a private lane which extends in a southerly direction from Cool Hollow Road, southeast of Hagerstown and Funkstown in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on an area of level ground and faces southwest.

The building is a two part, two story limestone structure, three bays wide at the front elevation. Roughly coursed stones are used and there appears to be no decorative masonry associated with the walls.

A two bay wing, also of stone construction extends to the rear of the building. A definite vertical seam in the masonry is present between the front and back sections from the beginning of the second story level to the eaves, indicating that the second story of the wing may be an addition. Its gable is of frame construction.

Windows have narrow frames finished with a bead at the inside edge. First story windows at the front section have nine over six pane sashes while second story windows have six over six sashes. Only two windows are present at the second story of the front elevation.

The main entrance is located in the central bay of the front elevation. It is framed similar to the windows and includes a narrow transom above the door.

A modern hipped roof porch extends across the front elevation.

The roof is sheathed with asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls of the house. Brick chimneys with several courses of corbeling at their tops are located inside the end walls. One small brick flue extends from inside the end of the wing.

Several frame domestic outbuildings are located behind the house. A frame bank barn is located to its west.

The buildings appear to be in excellent condition.


