DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmstead is located at the intersection of Manor Church, Wheeler and Monroe Roads, northwest of Boonsboro in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on an area of relatively level ground with the house facing east and the barn west.

The house is a two story, five bay limestone building with a two story, four bay ell extending to the rear or west. This wing would appear to be an addition or roughly contemporary date with the front section. Stones forming the walls of the main section are laid in relatively narrow courses with many of the joints retaining old "raised V" mortar. Long flat stones form many of the door and window lintels. There is a distinct difference in the masonry of the back section which shows much less coursing. The south elevation of the wing is sheathed with stucco.

Windows in the front section have moderately wide frames with their corner joints secured with wooden pins. Windows have two over two pane Victorian period sashes with upper panes having arched tops. Hinge pins for shutters remain in the frames.

The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. The Victorian door has four panels with the two upper sections having arched tops. It is hung beneath a two light transom. An older type of paneling appears on the jambs. Other entrances are present at both levels of a two story porch along the south wall of the wing and in its north elevation.

The house is roofed with standing seam sheet metal which terminates with barge boards set directly against the end walls. Brick chimneys are located inside the gables. Old style wooden scaffolding has been standing at the front and north walls of this house for some time. It would appear that repointing work was begun and never finished.

Behind the house is a brick outbuilding which could have been a secondary dwelling. Southeast of the house is a large stone end bank barn. Its gable peaks is finished with frame. Running perpendicular to Manor Church Road is a pair of parallel stone fences which suggest the presence of a field lane or old road.

The buildings appear to be in fair to good condition.




