DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This complex is located at the end of a private lane extending in a northerly direction from Cool Hollow Road, southeast of Funkstown in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on an area of level ground and face south.

The house is a three part structure consisting of a two story, two bay German sided log structure, apparently the oldest part and a two story, three bay stone addition. Extending perpendicular to the log section is a one story three bay stucco coated stone kitchen.

The log section was constructed of chestnut and walnut wood. According to the owner, renovations of the interior revealed an older roof line suggesting that a one story log building was enlarged to two stories. A Victorian semi-hexagonal projecting bay was added to the east end wall.

The stone section is built of roughly coursed limestone and adjoins the west end wall of the log part. Small squarish stones centered between two larger rectangular blocks are present above the windows. There are no exterior doors in the stone section. Windows have narrow frames which hold nine over six pane sashes at the first story level and six over six sashes at the upper story.

Modern asphalt shingles shelter the roof and small brick chimneys are located inside the end walls.

East of the house is a stone bank barn with framed gables and a forebay.

The buildings are in excellent condition and stand on a farm containing 52.95 acres.

Most of the easily visible datable evidence in the log section is either covered or removed making the age of this building difficult to assess. The stone two story addition has the appearance of having been built during the second quarter of the 19th century.


