DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a one and a half story, five bay structure located on the west side of U.S. Route 40-A at Benevola. It faces east. Apparently of balloon frame construction, the house was built in two parts, its two southern bays added by the present owner who has resided in the house since the 1920's. Imitation brick composition siding sheaths the entire building.

Windows and doors are trimmed with early 20th century style flat topped architraves. Most main story windows have two over two pane sashes, while six light sashes are used in the south end. Half windows are present in the upper story and a modern window has been installed in the north gable. Entrances are located in the second and fourth bays. A modern shed roofed porch supported by metal poles extends along the front elevation.

The roof is finished with sheet metal and chimneys are located toward the rear of the house.
