DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located at the end of a long private lane which extends in a southerly direction from Mill Point Road, north of Boonsboro in Washington County, Maryland. It stands on an area of level ground and faces east. It is a two story, three bay brick structure resting on low fieldstone foundations. The bricks are laid in American bond at all elevations and flat arches of long, narrow, angle-formed bricks are present above the openings.

Windows have narrow frames finished with a bead at the inside edge and hold six over six pane sashes. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. The door is hung beneath a three light transom. The south end bay of the front elevation is now a window, but modern brick work beneath it suggests that it may have been a door at one time.

Extending across the front wall is a 20th century porch with square pillars resting on brick piers.

Small brick chimneys are located inside the end walls. A modern block flue extends up most of the height of the south end wall.

A new addition, one story high and two bays wide is attached to the back of the house. South of the house is a frame outbuilding with an exterior stone firebox.

The buildings are in excellent condition.
