DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmstead is located at the intersection of Mill Point and Wheeler Roads, northwest of Boonsboro in Washington County, Maryland. The house is located at the side of Mill Point Road and faces south. It is a two story, five bay limestone structure and is T-shaped with a two story, two bay wing, also of stone, extending to the rear. There is no decorative masonry associated with the windows, doors or the wall construction.

Openings are aligned with each other in the walls although they are not arranged symmetrically. Windows have narrow frames finished with a bead at the inside edge. Most have six over six pane sashes. At the front elevation, windows have been elongated and have single pane sashes. A semi-hexagonal projecting bay has been added to the first story of the front elevation in the central area. Most windows have pairs of louvered shutters.

Entrances are located in the second and fourth bays of the front elevation. They are framed similarly to the windows and include a transom. A porch which appears to date from the early 20th century extends across the front elevation. It is supported by round pillars. The wing has a double porch included under the main roof span of the east facade.

Asphalt shingles finish the roof which extends beyond the end walls. Brick chimneys which appear to be replacements are located inside the end walls.

East of the house is a frame bank barn with board and batten siding. Other agricultural and domestic outbuildings are located between the house and barn.

It is one of several farms in the immediate vicinity which belongs to the United States Steel Corp. The farms are valued by the steel company for their rich limestone deposits.


UTM GRID AND 1971 MAGNETIC NORTH DECLINATION AT CENTER OF SHEET
