DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located at the corner of Dog Street Road and Eakles Mill Road south of Keedysville in Washington County, Maryland.

The house is a two story, three bay log structure sheathed with asbestos shingles and facing north toward Dog Street Road. A one story, three bay stone addition with an exterior stone chimney extends to the rear or south.

Windows of the log section are small and spaced irregularly in the walls. Their original sashes have been replaced with two over two pane sashes. The main entrance is located in the central bay of the front elevation and is offset toward the west. Above the door is a narrow transom which raises the height of the door head above that of the window lintels. Extending across the front elevation is an elaborate Victorian front porch with turned posts and gingerbread trim.

Decorative brackets finishes the eaves at the front and rear elevation and across the end walls forming small pent roofs which do not appear to be original.

The log portion of the house has a centrally placed brick chimney.

Behind the house are ruins of a log barn and various agricultural and domestic outbuildings.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This complex would appear to date from the 18th century and thus is significant as one of Washington County's early farms. The house is of log construction and follows the central chimney Germanic plan which is found in Pennsylvania and in areas such as Washington County, Maryland where a German influence is strong.

Several 18th century complexes remain along Dog Street Road which is one of the County's oldest thoroughfares.
