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**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This farm complex is improved with a brick house which displays numerous 18th century exterior features. It is a two story, four bay structure with Flemish bonding utilized at the front and gable side elevations. A molded brick water table extends along the same walls. A two story, two bay addition, also of brick construction extends to the rear.

Original massive pegged window frames remain at the attic level. The house has two front doors centered side by side in the facade. One of these doors appears to have been altered.

Near the house is a stone springhouse and ruins of a frame bank barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The brick house in this farm complex could date from the 18th century. Features suggesting this early construction are the use of Flemish bond and the presence of a water table at the side as well as the front walls and the remaining 18th or early 19th century type of window frames at the attic level.

Very few brick houses dating from before 1820 are to be found in rural Washington County, the favored building materials at that time being log or stone. The rarity of 18th or early 19th century brick farm structures makes this building particularly significant among Washington County's architecture and definitely worthy of further study.


