DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This mid-19th century complex is located at the end of a long dirt lane that perhaps was once a public road. It leads to a fording place on the Little Antietam Creek beyond which is the farm complex. The house is a two story brick structure with a recessed double porch along part of its front elevation. It would appear to date from the middle third of the 19th century. A frame bank barn and wagon shed stand nearby.

At the point where the road crosses the Creek are remains of an old stone quarry. Running along most of the length of the road is an old fieldstone fence.


