DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story, five bay frame house was built by George Eakle about 1900. Its exterior surface is of narrow gauge siding with decorative cut shingles forming the surface of the cross gables which appear on the two principal facades of the building. Decorative turnings trim the porch which extends around two sides of the house. Semi hexagonal projecting bays have split turnings applied between the windows. The roof utilizes a combination of hip and gable framing systems and is sheathed with slate with decorative imbrication.




