DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmstead is located near the area known as Smoketown. The house is a two story four bay brick structure built in common bond at all elevations. Window and door heads are segmentally arched. The house is painted red and would appear to date from the last quarter of the 19th century. It has two front doors side by side centered in the main facade. Also part of the complex is a frame and stone bank barn, and log and stone outbuildings. According to an occupant of the house, the present dwelling replaced an earlier log building which stood just to its east.


