DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story, six bay stone house was built in two parts. The older part is said to be the three northern bays which according to the owner of the property were built in the 1780's by a Yost Deaner. The additions to the house are said to date from the third quarter of the 19th century. Exterior features would appear to date from the second half of the 19th century. Among the most prominent is an ornate cast iron porch with a hipped roof. Along the front of the house is a course of massive brackets.
