DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This complex includes a two story, five bay brick L-shaped house, a stone bank barn dated 1818, ruins of a one story stone springhouse and secondary dwelling and various domestic and agricultural outbuildings. The house is constructed in Flemish bond at the front elevation. At its central entrance is an ornate cast iron porch with a hipped roof. Evidence of put log holes can be seen along an end wall. The side and rear walls are laid in common bond with only three rows of stretchers between header courses. Interior woodwork as well as exterior appearance suggests that the house was built during the 1830's or 40 's. It was at one time approached by a lane leading from the north toward the front of the house. This is now part of a cow pasture. The barn is constructed of coursed stones. In its north end wall is a large dressed stone which carries the date and some letters that could not be read.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This complex shows two periods of building. Presumably there was an earlier house of the 1818 period when the barn was built. The present house is later and shows a number of refinements. It is one of a few brick houses in the area that dispays put-log holes. Although they were commonly present during construction for scaffolding in most houses the holes were filled to match the brickwork.




