The Brick House is a five-bay two-story house with a gable roof. The main facade has a central entrance with Victorian-style doors and arch-pane transom. Two-over-two sash windows and in the other bays of the first and second stories. There is a three-bay entrance porch on Tuscan style columns. On the southern gable end there is a two-story porch that is screened on the first floor and open with boxed posts and stick railings on the second. On the rear there is a one-story addition.

Two-over-two sash windows and in the other bays of the first and second stories. There is a three-bay entrance porch on Tuscan style columns. On the southern gable end there is a two-story porch that is screened on the first floor and open with boxed posts and stick railings on the second. On the rear there is a one-story addition. The house appears to date from the late 19th century.

This property is located on the east side of Rt. 65, .3 mile south of Lappans Road. It is located in a cluster of late 19th century buildings in the village of Lappans. The main facade faces west.

The property is constructed on a stone foundation. The main facade is marked by the entrance porch and plain window frames and molded cornice. The roof has a sheet metal covering. There are brick chimney stacks interior at each gable end.

There is a modern garage on the property.


