BUILDING DATE: early-mid 19th century

145 West Main Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, symmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, five-bay, brick, freestanding residential structure resting on a stone foundation. It is set directly at the public-right-of-way. The side-gable, standing-seam metal roof has two massive endwall, brick chimneys. The building was built in two sections: the eastern two bays are laid in common bond and the western three bays are laid in Flemish bond. The first-floor front facade is composed of an entrance in what is now the center bay and windows in the flanking bays. The second-floor design consists of windows directly above the corresponding openings on the first floor. The entrance is defined by two frame pilasters with Greek fret motifs and a pediment and is composed of a recessed set of raised, four-pane double doors topped by a multi-pane rectangular transom. The windows appear to be modern replacements and consist of double-hung, six-over-six lights with incised wood lintels and paneled shutters. The windows in the western portion of the building have a brick course above the lintels, further defining the fenestration. A Colonial Revival open porch is located at the eastern end of the building. It protects a secondary entrance to the structure. There is also a small Queen Anne window in the second story of this facade. The side yard is enclosed by a wrought iron fence.

Houses built with Flemish bond are most common during the first part of the 19th century, before 1840. Therefore, it is likely that at least the western portion of the building was extant

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at the time. A building of the same configuration is noted on the 1877 map of the town as being owned by R. Shaffer. The 1922 Sanborn notes this as 201 West Main Street and indicates a garage in the northwest corner of the property. Today, the building is used for residential purposes and also houses the Village Shop Antiques.


The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the possible Development Period of Rural Agrarian Intensification, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
