
BUILDING DATE: mid-19th century

109 East Antietam Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story, two-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure set directly at the public-right-of-way. The building appears to have been extensively remodeled as it has the features of a 1920s cottage, but has the 1862 commemorative plaque on it. It is possible that the building is of log construction. It is currently sided with asbestos shingling that was popular in the 1920s and 1930s and has three-over-one windows set in pairs or triplets--a design that is also characteristic of that period. The side gable roof is sheathed with standing-seam metal and has a long, shed dormer. The structure has a one-story wing to the rear.

A building of the same configuration is noted on the 1877 map of the town as being owned by H. Good. The 1922 Sanborn notes the extant dwelling as 307 East Antietam and indicates that it is one of the few structures on the block defined by the alleys to the east and west of the building.


The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.


