BUILDING DATE: 1920s-1930s

This is a south-facing, horizontally massed, symmetrical, two-story, two-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure set directly at the public-right-of-way. Covered with asbestos shingling, the building has a side-gable roof sheathed in artificial roll. There is an exterior, brick chimney on the west elevation. The east-bay entrance is protected by a shed-roof, open porch that extends across the facade. It is supported by three Tuscan columns. Fenestration consists of double-hung, one-over-one windows set in pairs (second floor) or triplets (first floor). All openings on the front elevation have shutters. There is a one-story wing to the rear.

Based on its style and the fact that the building is not noted on the 1922 Sanborn, it appears that the building was constructed in the late 1920s or the 1930s.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Modern Development Period, and falls in the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
