




BUILDING DATE: late 19th/early 20th century

109 West Antietam Street is a south-facing, vertically massed, asymmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, frame, L-shaped, freestanding, residential structure set directly at the public-right-of-way. Resting on a stone foundation, the building has a side-gable roof covered with standing-seam metal. The roof has a center brick chimney, open and overhanging eaves, and gable returns. The recessed, center-bay entrance is protected by a hipped-roof, open porch that runs the length of the building and is supported by turned posts and pilasters. The door is a four-panel one with a transom above. Windows are set in wood frames and are double-hung, two-over-two sash. The structure has a two-story, frame wing to the rear. The yard contains several outbuildings, including a coal shed, barn, hog house, and henhouse.

The building is not indicated on the 1877 map of the town. The 1922 Sanborn notes this structure as 209 West Antietam and indicates a one-story frame structure at the northwest corner of the house and three frame buildings at the rear of the lot, including a two-story garage.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
