117 West Antietam Street is a south-facing, vertically massed, asymmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, frame, L-shaped, freestanding, residential structure set directly at the public-right-of-way. Resting on a stone foundation, the building has a side-gable roof covered with standing-seam metal. The roof has an endwall brick chimney, open and overhanging eaves, and gable returns. The center-bay entrance is protected by a hipped-roof, open porch that runs the length of the building and is supported by modern iron railing. The door is a four-panel one with a fanlight. Windows are set in wide wood frames and are double-hung, two-over-two sash. The structure has a two-story, frame wing to the rear.

A building in this location is indicated on the 1877 map of the town as being owned by Mrs. Howers. The 1922 Sanborn notes the extant structure as 205 East Antietam and indicates the two-story rear wing has been enlarged since the 1992 map was produced.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
