
110 West Antietam Street is a north-facing, asymmetrical, one-and-a-half-story, five-bay, stone and frame, freestanding, residential structure. The structure is built above grade and has a low stone retaining wall at the street. The eastern portion of the house is constructed of stone, while the western half is frame (possibly log). They are joined by a common, side-gable roof covered with corrugated metal. There are interior, endwall brick chimneys at either end of the building. There is also a long, modern, one-story, shed-roof addition extending from the west elevation. The original entrance to the building, which was located in the center bay, has been converted to a window. An open, hipped-roof porch shielded the former entrance and the window immediately to its right. The current entrance to the building is not visible from the street. Windows are double-hung, nine-over-six sash.

A building of similar configuration is noted on the 1877 map of the town as being owned by Mrs. Myers. The extant building is noted with its stone and frame main body and a one-story rear, frame addition on the 1922 Sanborn. The west addition is not indicated.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Intensification, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
