

BUILDING DATE: late 19th/early 20th century

321 West Main Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, symmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, L-shaped, frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is covered with manufactured siding, is set directly at the public-right-of-way. The side-gable, standing-seam metal roof has two endwall chimneys--a brick interior one and a cinderblock exterior one. The center-bay craftsman door is shielded by a modern storm door and a gabled portico supported by fluted columns. Fenestration consists of double-hung, two-over-two sash windows with shutters. There is a two-story wing to the rear and a one-story porch which is now enclosed.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Themes of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
