103 North Church Street is a west-facing, asymmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building has been extensively remodeled with the addition of manufactured siding, the partial enclosure of the front porch and the reconfiguration of some of the windows. It has a side-gable, artificial roll roof with open eaves and an interior, endwall brick chimney. The focus of the first floor is a raised, hipped-roof wrap-around porch that is now partially enclosed. The porch roof is supported by Tuscan columns. All windows have been replaced with modern, double-hung, one-over-one metal frame ones. The house has a two-story wing to the rear.

The building may date to the early 20th century. It is noted on the 1922 Sanborn as "B" North Church.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
