205 East Antietam Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, symmetrical, one-and-a-half-story, three-bay, freestanding, residential structure. It is set directly at the public-right-of-way, high above grade, on a stone foundation. The building is sheathed in manufactured siding. The side-gable, artificial roll roof has open and overhanging eaves and a shed dormer. The first-floor front facade has an entrance with a modern door in the west bay and windows in the two remaining bays. There is an open, hipped-roof porch across the facade. It is supported by modern iron rails. Windows are double-hung, one-over-one sash. The structure has a long one-story flat-roof wing to the rear.

A building of the same configuration is noted on the 1877 map of the town as being owned by Mrs. Peterman. The 1922 Sanborn notes a building, which may be this one, at 403 East Antietam.







