206 East Antietam Street is a north-facing, symmetrical, two-story, frame, three-bay, freestanding, residential structure resting on a stone foundation. Set directly at the public-right-of-way, it has a one-story, gable-roof addition and a one-story shed addition on its east elevation. The entire composition has been covered with manufactured siding. The first-floor front facade of the main body is composed of an entrance in the center bay and double-hung windows in the flanking bays. There is also an entrance in the one-story addition (which may pre-date the two-story portion). It is located in its center bay and also has double-hung windows flanking it. A common shed-roof open porch extends across the addition and the main body of the house. It is supported by wood posts. Windows are set in wide frames and are six-over-six (in the addition) and two-over-two (main body) sash.

The 1922 Sanborn notes a one-story structure on this site. It is numbered 406 East Antietam. It is not indicated on the 1877 map.






