This is a west-facing, symmetrical, one-and-a-half-story, five-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure resting on a concrete foundation. Set directly at the public-right-of-way, it has been extensively altered with the addition of manufactured siding and the alteration of some window configurations. The side-gable roof is sheathed with standing-seam metal and has an interior endwall brick chimney and one gabled dormer. A shed-roof, open porch extends across the facade of the building. It is supported by chamfered posts with simple brackets. The entrance is located in the center bay. Fenestration consists of double-hung, one-over-one windows. The structure has a one-story rear, shed-roof wing and a detached garage.

A commemorative plaque indicates that this structure was standing in 1862. A building of the same configuration is noted on the 1877 map of the town as being owned by E. Huyett. However, no building is noted on the 1922 Sanborn at this location.






