

SITE NUMBER: WA-II-698

ADDRESS: South Church (west side between High Street and first alley to its north), Sharpsburg, MD

OWNER/LOT NUMBER/ACCESS: no owner given, P.4, private

BUILDING DATE: late 19th/early 20th century

This is an east-facing, vertically massed, symmetrical, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, frame, freestanding structure resting on a stone foundation. It is set at the public-right-of-way. The side gable roof is covered with metal and has open and overhanging eaves. The remains of a brick chimney can be seen on the front face of the roof above the center bay. Entrances are located on two elevations, both have horizontal, five-panel doors. Windows are generally double-hung, two-over-two sash. Some windows have been boarded up. The building is in deteriorated condition.

The structure appears to have been built for commercial purposes. The 1922 Sanborn notes it as the Odd Fellows Hall. The lot is vacant on the 1877 map.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Themes of Social; and Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Community Planning.
