No. 233 S. Main Street is a one-story, detached, side-gabled, stuccoed masonry, single-family dwelling set on a solid raised (full or English basement). The house is built into embankment that slopes steeply upward from street to the rear of lot. The house has 6/6 wood sash windows. The basement walls appear to have been thickened after their initial construction. The single-leaf half glass wood door is set into a deep paneled recess. The house has one exterior and one interior end chimney (exterior end chimney is modern). Though altered, this early nineteenth-century house retains enough of its general form to be considered as a contributing resource to the Town of Boonsboro Historic District.


23~~5~~³ South Main Street is a west-facing, horizontally massed, two-story, four-bay, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is set slightly back from the public-right-of-way, has a smooth stucco finish which may be over a log and stone structure. The building appears to have been built in two parts and has very thick walls. It has a side-gable, corrugated metal roof with two chimneys. A modern, two-story porch protects the center bay. Entrances are located on the first and second levels. The windows, which are double-hung, six-over-six, appear to be very old. There are remnants of a stone retaining wall on the property.

Although none of the historic maps of Boonsboro extends to this part of the town, based on other similar buildings in the area, the construction date of this structure is probably in the early to mid 19th century.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
