Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

No. 33-35 South Main Street is a two-story, four-bay-wide, detached, frame, side-gabled, double house clad in German siding. The house is set on a rubblestone foundation. The 2/2 wood sash windows have pedimental window hoods. Two interior end chimneys have simple corbeled caps. The two single-leaf entry doors are surmounted by transoms. A large, two-story gable addition to the rear has a partially enclosed integral gallery on the south elevation. A brick smoke house or summer kitchen is located off the southeast corner of the house. The house dates to the mid-nineteenth century and is a contributing resource to the Town of Boonsboro Historic District.



33-35 South Main Street is a west-facing, horizontally massed, two-and-a-half-story, four-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is set directly at the public-right-of-way, rests on a stone foundation and is divided into two units. It has a side-gable, artificial roll roof with two, endwall brick chimneys. A raised, hipped-roof porch extends across the facade of the house and protects the center-bay entrances. The doors each consist of a glazed panel above two recessed panels, topped by a two-light transom. Fenestration includes double-hung, two-over-two sash windows with pedimented window surrounds.

It is not clear if the building indicated on the 1877 map of the town near this location is the extant structure. However, Sanborn maps (1897-1940) indicate the structure and number it as 262 Main Street. Five outbuildings are shown on the maps until 1924 by which time three of the smallest frame structures have been removed.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
