Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

No. 418 N. Main Street is a two-and-one-half-story, three-bay-wide, masonry, single-family, detached dwelling on a rubblestone foundation. The house has a hip roof and hip-roofed dormers. Modern plate glass picture windows have been inserted at the first floor. Second-floor windows are 6/1 sashes. A shed overhang extends across first floor; there is a one-story, one-bay, portico with gable roof, round arch, and modillions, with paired support posts over single-leaf door with sidelights. The stuccoed masonry building may be brick. There is a hip roof frame garage on a stone and concrete block foundation southwest of the house. As an example of early-twentieth-century domestic architecture (the combination of the American Foursquare and the Colonial Revival) in the Town of Boonsboro, this house is a contributing resource to the Town of Boonsboro Historic District.





418 North Main Street is an east-facing, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, stucco, freestanding, Colonial Revival American Four Square residential structure. The building, which is slightly set back from the public-right-of-way, rests on a brick foundation and is faced in a smooth stucco. The clipped, hipped roof is covered with an artificial shingling and has one chimney. There are hipped-roof dormers facing from each elevation. A Colonial Revival pedimented portico supported by paired columns protects the center-bay entrance which is composed of a raised paneled door, flanked by sidelights, and topped by a transom. Secondary entrances are located in the north and south facades. Flanking the entrance on the front facade are slightly projecting, hipped-roof, squared bays with fixed multi-paned lights. All other windows on the house are double-hung, six-over-one sash. Windows on the front facade consist of fixed lights on the first floor. There is an enclosed two-story porch on the back of the house.

Although none of the historic maps of Boonsboro extends this far north, the construction of the building can be dated approximately to the period between 1910 and 1924 by its style and the fact that it is very similar to other buildings in Boonsboro that were built during this time period.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
