210 S. Main Street is a heavily modified early-nineteenth-century log house. The one-and-one-half-story, three-bay, side-gabled, frame, detached, single-family dwelling looks more like a 1930s-era house. It has 3/1 wood sash windows, asphalt-shingle roofing and aluminum siding. There is one interior end and one exterior end corbel-capped brick chimney. A three-bay shed dormer spans the half-story. West of the house is a gable-front frame garage and a shed, both early mid-twentieth-century. Though altered, this house is a contributing resource to the Town of Boonsboro Historic District.


210 South Main Street is an east-facing, horizontally massed, two-story, three-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure. It has been extensively remodeled. The building, which is set at the public-right-of-way, rests on a stone foundation and is covered with manufactured siding. It has a side-gable, artificial shingle roof with one corbelled brick chimney and one exterior brick chimney. There is a large shed-roof dormer across the front of the house. A nw portico protects the front entrance which is located in the north bay. Windows are double-hung, three-over-one.

According to the owner, the house is built of log, most of which is extant, except for the front wall which was removed during a remodeling. It appears, from the style of the windows and the dormer, that the house may have undergone a remodeling in the 1920s. The siding is more recent.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the possible Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.


