110 Potomac Street is a north-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story, five-bay, brick, freestanding, residential structure. The building is set directly at the public-right-of-way, rests on a stone foundation, and is laid in a flemish bond that has been painted red. The side-gable roof is sheathed with corrugated metal and has two dormers facing the street and two, endwall chimneys. The center-bay entrance is located below a flat-roof porch that extends across the center three bays of the house. The four-panel door is topped by a transom that has been boarded up. Windows on the first floor and in the dormers are double-hung, two-over-two sash with rounded upper panes. The structure has two, one-story frame additions on the back elevation.

A building of similar configuration is indicated on the 1877 map of the town. The 1910-1940 Sanborn maps all show the same structure (numbered 76 Potomac Street), but only show one frame addition and only a portico over the front entrance.


The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
