115 Potomac Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story, four-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is set directly at the public-right-of-way, has a side-gable, tin roof with a new chimney. A shed-roof porch supported by modern iron railings extends across the facade of the house and protects the center-bay entrance. The door is obscured by a storm door, but appears to have a glazed upper panel. The fenestration is double-hung, one-over-one sash on the front facade and two-over-one on the side elevations. The structure has a two-story cinderblock addition to the rear. There are two sheds on the property.

A building of similar configuration is indicated on the 1877 map of the town. The 1910-1940 Sanborn maps show the building, without its addition, as 38 Potomac Street.


The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
