



14 St. Paul Street is a north-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story, brick, attached, residential structure. The building, which is set directly at the public-right-of-way, rests on a stone foundation, and is brick set in a common bond and painted white. It has a side-gable, artificial roll roof with two chimneys and a large dormer across the front that has two sets of paired windows. The entrance is located in the center bay and consists of a six-panel door topped by a four-light transom. Windows are double-hung, six-over-six on the first floor and one-over-one in the attic story. The house has several rear additions.

The building is noted on the 1877 atlas and on the 1897-1940 Sanborn maps as 143.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
