



23 St. Paul Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story, three-bay, frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is set directly the public-right-of-way is covered with manufactured siding and may be of log construction. It has a side-gable roof covered with tin and has a chimney directly at the center of the roof. The entrance, which is located in the west bay, consists of a multi-pane glazed door. The windows are all double-hung, one-over-one sash. The building has a one-story concrete block shed-roof addition to the east and a one-story rear addition.

A building of similar configuration to the extant structure is indicated on the 1877 map of the town. The 1897-1940 Sanborns indicate this structure is frame with a brick addition and number it 148 St. Paul.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
