



15-17 St. Paul Street is a south-facing, horizontally massed, two-and-a-half-story, seven-bay, frame, double house. The building, which is set directly at the public-right-of-way, is covered with manufactured siding. It has a side-gable, corrugated metal roof with two chimneys and open eaves. The entrances are located in the second and sixth bays and consists of a glazed panel over two wood panels. Windows are double-hung, six-over-six sash. The house has a one-story shed-roof addition on the rear.

The building is noted on the 1877 atlas as two separate structures. However, by 1897, they appear to have been joined and are numbered 121 and 122 East Church. No other changes are shown on any of the later historic maps. According to Doug Bast, they are of log construction.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Agricultural-Industrial Transition, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
