
36 High Street is a northwest-facing, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, frame, freestanding, Queen Anne residential structure. The building, which is set at the public-right-of-way, rests on a stone foundation and has been covered in manufactured siding. It has a cross-gable, artificial roll roof with open eaves, gable returns, two brick chimneys, and decorative bargeboards. A hipped-roof eastlake porch extends across the facade of the house and protects a one-story bay window and the entrance. The door appears to date from the 1950s and is topped by a two-light transom. Fenestration includes double-hung, two-over-two sash windows. The structure has a large, two-story ell with a one-story shed-roof addition.

A building of similar configuration is indicated at this location on the 1877 map of the town. However, the style of the building indicates that it was probably constructed later. It is possible that an earlier structure was either replaced by the extant one or was extensively remodeled. The 1877 map also notes that the property was owned by J. Reapsomer. None of the Sanborn maps show this section of Boonsboro.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
