108 Lakin Street is a north-facing, two-story, three-bay, brick, freestanding, French Classical Revival structure. The building, which is set on a landscaped lawn, rests on a brick foundation and is laid in a running bond of red brick and light grey mortar. The brick is laid to resemble quoining at the corners and is used to articulate the bays and stories. The tall hipped roof is covered with artificial shingles and the roofline is interrupted by the top of the second-story windows. The windows are all double-hung, six-over six sash.

The structure is not shown on any of the historic maps of Boonsboro, indicating that it was constructed after 1940. Based on its style, it appears to have been built in the 1940s.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Modern Development Period, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
