116 Lakin Street is a north-facing, horizontally massed, one-and-a-half-story, brick and frame, freestanding, bungalow. The building, which is on a lawn back from the public-right-of-way on a concrete foundation, is laid in a dark red brick set in a dark grey mortar. The structure has a side-gable, artificial roll roof with wide, open, eaves; exposed rafters; a tall, gabled dormer facing the street; and an exterior wall brick chimney that punctures the roof. The roof slopes down to create the roof of the porch which is supported on brick piers. The windows are double-hung three-over-one in pairs on the first floor and three-over-one triplets on the second floor. The first-floor windows have concrete lintels. The center-bay entrance has an eight-light door over wood panels.

None of the historic maps of Boonsboro show this section of town. However, based on the style of the structure, as well as the construction date of other similar buildings in Boonsboro, this building was probably erected between 1910 and 1924.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
