134 Lakin Street is a north-facing, two-story, craftsman style, stone and frame, freestanding, residential structure. The building, which is on a landscaped lawn, rests on a brick foundation. The first floor is constructed of small, densely packed stones. The upper floor is frame with wood shingles. The jerkin-head roof is covered with artificial roll and has exposed rafters, two chimneys, and a shed dormer facing west. The windows are vertical five- and three-over-one on the first floor and are set in groups of three. Those on the second floor are vertical four-over-one set in pairs. There are also casement windows on the side elevations. The porch is supported by stone pillars.

Based on the style of the structure, as well as the date when Lakin Street was being developed, it is likely that this structure was constructed between 1924 and 1940.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Modern Development Period, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
