11 Young Avenue is a south-facing, one-and-a-half-story, three-bay, frame, freestanding, bungalow. It is the only historic structure on this street. The building, which is set near the public-right-of-way, rests on a concrete block foundation. It has a side-gable, artificial roll roof with open eaves and a deep, gabled dormer facing the street. The porch roof is contiguous with the roof structure. The porch extends the full width of the house and protects the center-bay entrance.

None of the historic maps of Boonsboro show this section of town. However, based on the style of the building, it appears to have been constructed in the 1920s.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the probable Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.
