Description

This house located on the east side of North Main Street is a two story, three bay L-shaped frame structure with a central entrance and gabled roof. It is sheathed with German siding and has two over two pane window sash with louvered shutters. Peaked architraves top the openings. The roof covering is standing seam sheet metal and there are chimneys inside each gable end.

It is typical of the vernacular turn-of-the-century period houses in Keedysville.


